By August 2020, The Frist Foundation was seeing nonprofit agencies step up as never before to service clients and community. Jobs were redefined, remote working had become commonplace, and agencies found new ways to carry out their missions.

At the same time, COVID-19 continued to loom as an ever-present threat. Employees were working longer hours, feeling family stresses, absorbing client anxiety, and neglecting their health. What's more, there was no end in sight.

Recognizing the key role of front-line employees in the pandemic response, The Frist Foundation offered grants to 28 of its key partners to help employees deal with the prolonged stress of working under trying conditions.
